Historic Location of the Month

Portobelo, Panama

At the port of Portobelo, Military fortifications were built from 1600 to 1753 to protect port. In 1668, the Welsh Buccaneer Sir Henry Morgan attacked Portobelo, using ladders wide enough to carry 3 men abreast to scale the walls of the fortifications. For a month the pirates occupied the city, but no substantial damage to the defensive structures was reported. In 1688 English Pirate Bartholomew Sharp and French buccaneer La Sound attacked the fortifications and caused different degrees of damage.

Since this campaign will give club members an opportunity to build relevant forces and put them on the table, I will be running games at Hobby Town on Friday nights and at the club meetings during the summer. The campaign starts June 4th with weekly suggested scenarios. The first week is small force actions called "Scouting Parties." Players put together forces of 50 points, so it's good for new players. Each player might even get in a couple games since the forces are so small!



At the club meeting on June 11th, we will be doing a naval action with the theme "Dangerous Territory." This will put the ship captains in shoal riddled waters while they try to accomplish their objectives. Or maybe, well set up an attempt to run the guns of a fort to escape!

After that, I or others can run the weekly theme at Hobby Town or your own location and I will run games at the June and July meetings. The whole summer looks as follows:

June 4-10; Scouting Parties, 50 point game

June 11-17; Dangerous Territory, Use 2 or more shoals or a fort

June 18-24; Keep your Eyes Peeled, Play a night scenario or Caught Unawares scenario

June 25-July1: Bark Wars, Include a Bark or a 4/4 ship in the scenario

July 2-8; Doldrums, Play a sea game where the wind starts at -2

July 9-15, Raise the Black, Play a scenario from the RTB expansion

July 16-22, Fire and Smoke, Use Fire or Smoke in the game

July 23-29, Native Alliance, Include at least one Natives unit in your force

July 30-August 5: Men of Legend, Include a Legendary Commander in your force

Battle of Hooey River

After Action Report By CMH Member Richard Kasten

The Battle of the Hooey River from "Janissaries, Clan and Crown" was the basis for an ADLG(F) scenario.

Matt Johnson took command of the 'Westmen' and fielded three corps, each of ten Light Cavalry Bow and one general with a bodyguard unit of Light Cavalry Bow/Javelin. The corps were led by the Red Rock, Silver Wolf, and Two Waters clans.

Dick Fickles took command of the Allies. King Gaton's knights (2xMKt, 4xHC, 2xLC); Legate Titus Frugi's Romans (6xHC, 2xLC, 2xLI); and Major Mason's Calivermen (LMG, Artillery, 4x Firearms, 2x LgBw).



The Allies had bombarded the Westmen's camp overnight and had been interrupted in their march back to their main camp. Swarms of Westmen had caused the Allies to retreat to various hills along the Hooey River. The Westmen found a large concentration of their warriors between Ganton and the Romans as our battle begins (picture above)

The Westmen had the first bound of turn one and advanced into firing range of Ganton and Mason (giving two disorder results with bow fire). The Red Rock clan gathered an additional unit through reinforcements.

In the Allied bound, Ganton charged off the hill and the Westmen met him in melee. Ganton's wings were slow to deploy and some of his left flank heavy cavalry were overwhelmed (see picture below with the white skull).



Missiles were exchanged between Mason and the Two Waters clan, followed by a charge on turn two. The Light Machine Gun and artillery were taken by the Westmen, but at a cost. The rest of the Silver Wolf front line fell to the heavy cavalry lances (see picture on the next page with red skulls). At the end of turn two the Allies had taken 8 of 25 casualties toward breaking army morale, and the Westmen 19 of 33.

The right half of Ganton's knights continued to charge toward the Romans as they advanced to the edge of the forest. Mason attempted to envelope the right flank of the Two Waters line, but the light horse disengaged on their right while pressing in on the left. By turn three each Westmen command had received two additional units by reinforcement. Casualties had risen to 10/25 Allied and 31/33 Westmen.



At the end of the first bound of turn four, the Westmen morale broke (35/33). Tactical victory for the Allies, but a strategic draw as all Westmen commanders survived.

Unlike the 'historical' event, in our battle the Westmen tried to overwhelm Ganton's knights with numbers. While successful in killing a third of the knights and taking Mason's artillery and the light machinegun, the Westmen broke morale at the carnage inflicted upon them.
